Frasier Celebrated Opening of Heritage Hall, Preserving Community Legacy

BOULDER, Colo. – Frasier celebrated the opening of Heritage Hall, a permanent exhibit honoring the organization’s history and the people who helped shape its 65-year legacy in Boulder.

Created in partnership with the Boulder Museum of Contemporary Art, the exhibit marked the culmination of a yearlong celebration and reflected years of collaboration among residents and team members to preserve and share Frasier’s story through photographs, artifacts and personal histories.

During the opening celebration, Christie Hinrichs spoke about the significance of Heritage Hall as both a tribute to Frasier’s past and to the residents and team members who continue to shape its future. Hinrichs also recognized residents Bev Carrigan, Sue Beckley and Penny Lester for their work documenting Frasier’s history through photographs and storytelling.

The event also welcomed Chris Frasier and Leanna Frasier, as well as resident Dorothy Rupert, who attended Frasier’s groundbreaking ceremony in 1958, creating a meaningful connection between the organization’s beginnings and its present-day community.

Heritage Hall was designed by exhibition designer Megan Adams as a space for reflection, learning and discovery. The project also reflected the collaborative efforts of Eve Dreher, Colleen Ryan Mallon and partners from the Boulder Museum of Contemporary Art.

Founded in 1960, Frasier is an independent nonprofit life plan community serving nearly 500 older adults across the continuum of care, including independent living, assisted living, memory support, skilled nursing, rehabilitation and wellness services. Heritage Hall was created to preserve Frasier’s legacy while celebrating the people and stories that continue to shape its future.
