



Frasier Receives Grant From People and Pollinators Action Network

Boulder, CO: Frasier, a Boulder retirement community, announced it received a \$1,200 grant from the [People and Pollinators Action Network](#) (PPAN) to support the community's resident-led pollinator garden.

In 2021, a dedicated group of residents known as the Pollinator Pals created Frasier's first pollinator garden in honor of Earth Day. As part of the City of Boulder's [Pollinator Garden Project](#), the Pollinator Pals began growing native seedlings and added more native and naturalized plants to the community's campus gardens.

"The Pollinator Pals are dedicated to making Frasier one of the first institutional pollinator havens in Boulder," said Julie Soltis, Frasier's Director of Communications. "We appreciate being recognized for our community's commitment to conservation and sustainability," she added.

This is the first year the grants, ranging from \$500 to \$2,000, have been distributed by PPAN. Frasier was one of 18 applicants and the only senior living community to receive a grant. Grant funds come from PPAN's Colorado Pollinator License Plate Fund and other designated donations to support vital pollinator conservation and advocacy programs across the state.

The Pollinator Pals will use the grant funds to install more drip lines, purchase gardening equipment, and plant more perennial native plants.
